



## Graphic Organizers

Graphic organizers are a useful tool in any classroom. They help students classify, compare and contrast, describe, sequence, and even make decisions. Provide these graphic organizers to your students to assist them in learning a new topic or to assist them with a new assignment.

### **Brainstorming Web**

A brainstorming web is a useful organizer when starting from a central idea, concept, topic, or question. To use this tool, the student branches from the central idea defining main ideas and their details.

### **Question/Answer Chart**

Identifying questions about an unfamiliar topic is easy. When looking for the answers, provide your students with this simple chart to help organize the questions and their answers.

### **Spider Map**

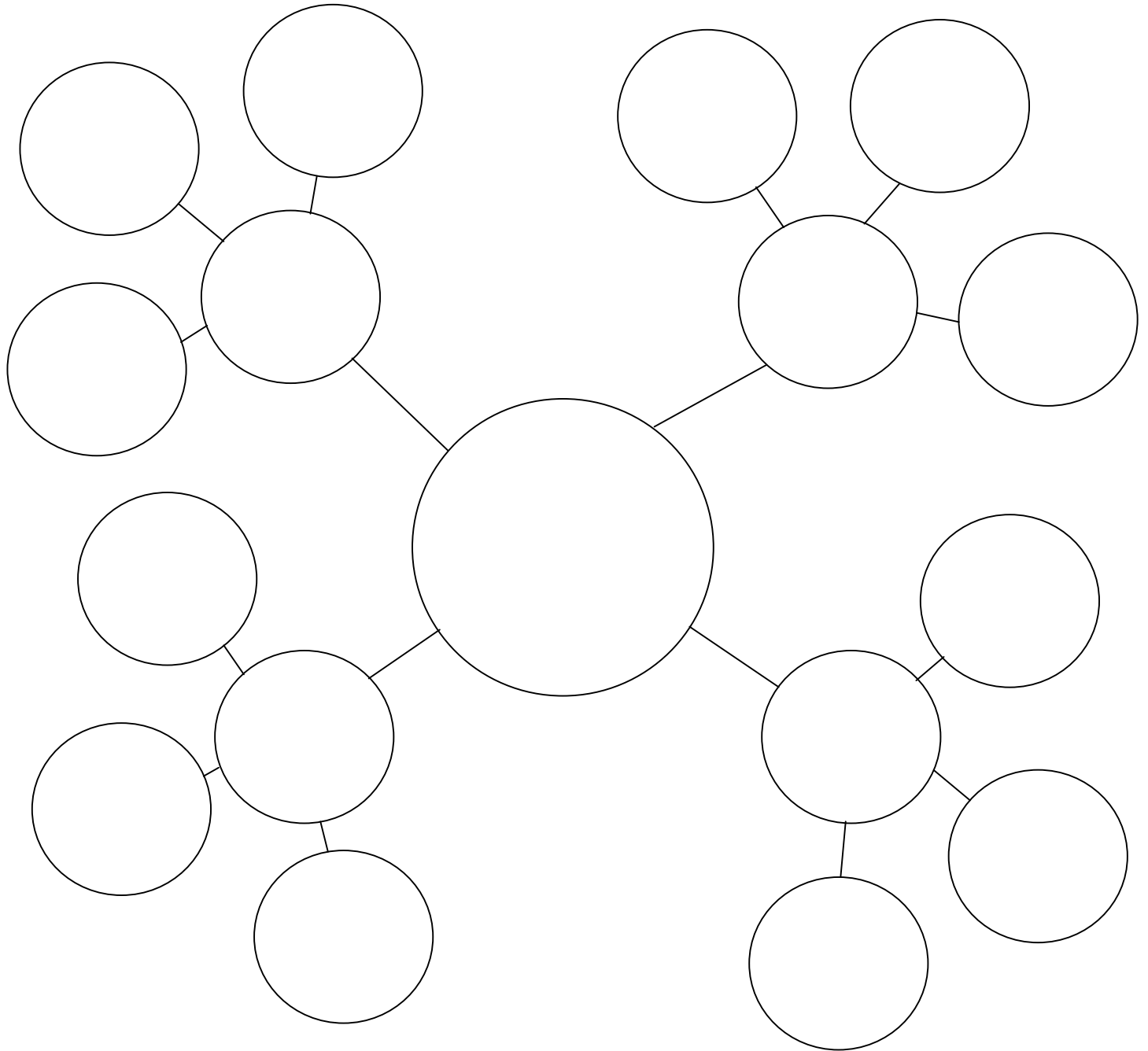
Use this graphic organizer to define a main idea or concept and identify its supporting details. Start with the concept or topic in the middle. Write main ideas on the diagonal lines and supporting details for each on the connected horizontal lines.

### **Venn Diagram**

This graphic organizer is useful when examining similarities and differences of two items such as people, places, things, events, etc. It allows space for characteristics specific to each item as well as those the two items have in common.
